Learning Targets

- Go through these with students
- OR ask different students to read them loud and proud

Slide 4

Silent Communication: Team building activity

Students bring pen and paper

Emphasize silence!

- Students line up according to birthdate
- Once they're lined up, put them into pairs
- Without talking, students observe his/her partner and record what they THINK they MIGHT have in common with their partners (2 minute timer)
- Compare notes (talking, yes)
 - Have students revise lists according to what they talked about.

Last Advisory juniors did a sticky note activity the generate ideas about improving culture at West

Slide 7

Parking was a big issue - the bond that passed last spring will improve parking, but not for a few years.

Slide 8

At dances students wear wristbands so that we can help them make healthy dancing choices. The wristband solution will go away when they act like their grandparents are watching them dance.

Encourage students to talk to admin and other adults if they want to see real change happen.

Preparing to Read activity

- Hand out two articles and Jigsaw graphic organizer
- Number paragraphs
- Underline main claim (make sure you have some sort of consensus on this)
- Have students write and complete the sentence frames

Slide 14

Jigsaw Activity - You're the expert! Read through slide with students

Slide 15

Jigsaw Step 1

- "Letter off" students A, B, C, D
- When students get their letter, they need to write it on the top of the graphic organizer AND mark the section of the article they are going to become experts on.

Slide 16

Jigsaw Step 1 Continued

- Re-read the section your were assigned
- Underline important information
- Left margin write notes on what they author says (summary)

Slide 17

Step 1 continued with individual work

- Right margin make notes on what the author is DOING
 - Examples are on the slide

BTW: This is an incredibly important skill because students have to be able to do this on the SBAC reading test and on the SAT. It's a step deeper than just summarizing.

Slide 18

Jigsaw Step 2: Time to collaborate

- Push desks (tables) together into four groups
- Each group is all one letter (All As, all Bs, all Cs, all Ds)
- Group members collaborate to complete the Alphabet Group Share-out Sheet (Jigsaw Step 2)

Slide 19

Jigsaw Step 3: Put your information together

- Students form heterogeneous groups so that they can share all of the "pieces of the puzzle."
- Each group should now have at least 1 A, 1 B, 1 C, and 1 D student
- They take turns sharing information and recording it in the appropriate spots on the back of the graphic organizer

Jigsaw Step 3 Continued: Record your learning

Students fill this out in the bottom box on the graphic organizer

Slide 21

Jigsaw Step 4: on the front of the graphic organizer

Students can collaborate to fill this in, or you can give them 5 minutes to do it quietly

Slide 22

Slide 23

How do EPIC and Sexting go together in regards to appropriate school behavior? Discuss with students:

- What does making an Effort with good internet behavior look like?
- What does showing pride with good internet behavior look like?
